BY TRAIN

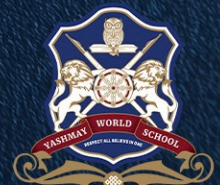


6-hour journey from Delhi to Lucknow via **Vande Bharat**, followed by a 2-hour drive from Lucknow Railway Station to the campus.
